How can I prepare for General Conference?

In the September 2011 First Presidency message, President Uchtdorf shared ways we can prepare ourselves for General Conference. Read the First Presidency Message <u>here</u>.

Other things to consider when preparing for General Conference:

- Add the times to your calendar. Here are the session times:
 - o Saturday, Oct 1 at 10 am MST
 - o Saturday, Oct 1 at 2 pm MST
 - Priesthood Saturday, Oct 1 at 6 pm, MST
 - o Sunday, Oct 2 at 10 am MST
 - Sunday, Oct 2 at 2 pm MST
- Find out where it is available in advance (see question below about availability)
- Review the blessings of general conference.
- Review the <u>highlights from last conference</u>.

How can I access General Conference?

General Conference is available through several different media channels worldwide. Here are the best ways to find General Conference in your area:

- Stake Center contact your bishop to find out if your Stake Center will broadcast the sessions of conference. For a complete listing of chapels around the world, visit our maps page.
- Television Available through <u>BYUtv</u>, <u>BYUtv International</u>, <u>KSL</u> and other TV stations worldwide. Check your local listings for availability.
- Radio Available through KSL Radio, BYU Radio (online or SiriusXM) and other radio stations throughout the world. Check your local listings.
- Internet Live broadcast available through LDS.org (<u>video</u> or <u>audio</u>) <u>facebook.com/LDS</u>, <u>BYUtv</u> and <u>BYUtv</u> <u>International</u>, as well as through the Mormon Channel (<u>app</u>, <u>online</u> and Roku channel).
- Conference Center To attend, see <u>ticket information</u>.

How can I help my children enjoy General Conference?


You can find activities for children, such as matching games and coloring prints <u>here</u>. Also, read how to <u>prepare</u> <u>your children</u> for General Conference.

When will conference materials be available?

Conference materials are available shortly after the session is over, sometimes within minutes. The <u>General</u> <u>Conference website</u> has the complete listing of formats, channels and availability.

What languages are available?

Conference is available as a live broadcast in several languages. For past General Conferences, select the language you want it translated into on the top right hand side of the transcripts page as indicated below. Live audio and yideo streaming is also available in multiple languages.




Can I put General Conference on my mobile device?

Once audio and videos files are available, you can download them and transfer to your device. You can also access General Conference audio and video files directly from the Mormon Channel on <u>iTunes</u>, <u>website</u> and <u>mobile app</u>.

Can I download just the music from General Conference?

Yes. When you select the conference you want, click on "Show Music" at the top of the page and all the songs will be displayed. You will then be able to download the songs as mp3 files or as video files.



Is General Conference on Twitter or Facebook?

Yes. General Conference will be broadcast live through the Church's <u>Facebook page</u>. You can also receive highlights of General Conference through the Church's General Conference <u>Twitter page</u>. Many Twitter users use the hashtags #lds and #mormon to flag tweets about the Church, and #ldsconf when following General Conference.

How can I share General Conference with others?

Many people are sharing their favorite quotes and stories from General Conference through social networks and blogs. Here are some practical and quick ways you can share conference with others:
