

Young Women Bookmark Invitation

- Page 1 - bookmark - print on cardstock. Cut and punch hole in corner
- Page 2 - watermark for back of bookmark wrap - print on colored copy paper
- Page 3 - inside of bookmark wrap - after printing both sides, cut in half and fold tightly around bookmark
- Page 4 - belly band - print on copy paper. Cut in strips and wrap around bookmark and wrap. Use sticker to close band on back.
- Page 5 - heart tag - Print on colored cardstock. Cut and punch hole in corner. Attach to bookmark with string
