


Lady"



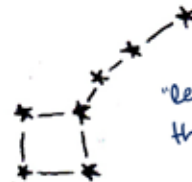
ORION
